

Democrats of Rossmoor November Book Club



David Pepper, at their monthly meeting November 6 at 3:00PM in MPR 2. All are welcome.

The publisher writes: "It's the statehouses, stupid." *Laboratories of Autocracy* shows that far more than the highprofile antics of politicians like Marjorie Taylor Greene or Jim Jordan—and yes, even bigger than Donald Trump's "Big Lie"—it's anonymous, often corrupt politicians in statehouses across the country who pose the greatest dangers to American democracy. Because these statehouses no longer operate as function-

ing democracies, these unknown politicians have all the incentive to keep doing greater damage, and can not be held accountable however extreme they get. This has driven



steep declines in states like Ohio and others across the country. And collectively, it's placed American democracy in its greatest peril since the dawn of the Jim Crow era. But

Pepper doesn't stop there. He lays out a robust prodemocracy agenda outlining how everyone from elected officials to business leaders to everyday citizens can fight back."

The book club of the Democrats of Rossmoor will discuss *Democracy Awakening: Notes on the State of America*, by Heather Cox Richardson, at the monthly meeting December 4 at 3:00PM in MPR 2. All are welcome.

In the midst of the impeachment crisis

of 2019, Heather Cox Richardson launched a daily Facebook essay providing the historical background of the daily torrent of news. It soon turned into a newsletter and its readership ballooned to more than 2,000,000 dedicated readers who rely on her plainspoken and informed take on the present and past in America.

In *Democracy Awakening*, Richardson crafts a compelling and original narrative, explaining how, over the decades, a small group

of wealthy people have made war on American ideals. By weaponizing language and promoting false history they have led us into authoritarianism - creating a disaffected population and then promising to recreate an imagined past where those people could feel important again. She argues that taking our country back starts by remembering the elements of the nation's true history that marginalized Americans have always upheld. Their dedication to the principles on which this nation was founded has enabled us to renew and expand our commitment to democracy in the past. Richardson sees this history as a road map for the nation's future.

Richardson's talent is to wrangle our giant, meandering, and confusing news feed into a coherent story that singles out what we

should pay attention to, what the precedents are, and what possible paths lie ahead. In her trademark calm prose, she is realistic and optimistic about the future of democracy. Her command of history allows her to pivot effortlessly from the Founders to the Abolitionists to Reconstruction to Goldwater


to Mitch McConnell, highlighting the political legacies of the New Deal, the lingering fears of socialism, the death of the liberal consensus and birth of "movement conservatism."


Rossmoor residents and friends are cordially invited to Peacock Hall on Monday November 13th at 1:00_{PM} to attend a film pro-

After jointly winning a local Drag Queen Pageant in New York City, Noxzema Jackson (Wesley Snipes) and Vida Boheme (Patrick Swayze), along with inexperienced Chi Chi Rodriguez (John Leguizamo), travel across country until their car breaks down in Snydersville, a small mid-western town. With just their wits and an endless supply of costumes,



they transform the town, everyone who lives there, and themselves!


Roger Ebert wrote that *"To Wong Foo* is the first movie about drag queens to be rated

PG-13, which it earns by being so relentlessly upbeat and wholesome that you walk out of the theater thinking of the queens as role models; every small town should be as lucky as Snydersville, and have its values transformed by them."

Chris Penn stands out in his delivery of homophobic, sexist and racist monologues that seem terribly timely! Ultimately, the comedy comes across as a celebration of openness, alter-

native lifestyles and bonding, all life-affirming values that in the 1990's are beyond reproach – or real controversy!



film will be the audience pleasing *The American President* (1995).

Directed by Rob Reiner with screenplay by Aaron Sorkin, the film stars Michael Douglas, Annette Benning, Richard Dreyfuss, Martin Sheen, and Michael J. Fox. The film's narrative focuses on Andrew Shepherd, a widowed U.S. President running for re-election, and Sydney Wade, an environmental lobbyist, who fall in love. Although their behavior is all above-board,

his political opponent launches an attack on the President's character – and sparks fly!

The film earned an Oscar nomination for Marc Shaiman's Musical Score and received 5 Golden Globe-nominations for Best Pic-



ture, Best Director (Reiner), Best Screenplay (Sorkin) and Best Actress (Benning). Roger Ebert gave the movie a 4-star review and described *The American President* as "an in-

telligent film about politics that is also a witty and warm romance. But what's most admirable is that real issues – gun control, the environment – are handled realistically." Additionally, the film provides a flawless re-creation of the White House, smart and amusing dialogue, and a charming love story that enhance the cinematic craftsmanship.

The film runs 2 hours 9 minutes and offers subtitles. Film enthusiast Lynne Thorner will fa-


